

History

Founded in 1982, The Piedmont School is a place where children who are struggling in a traditional educational environment can achieve their learning potential. Students in first through eighth grades attend the school's full-day and half-day programs during the traditional school year.

The Piedmont School is a co-educational, non-profit organization dedicated to educating children who have learning differences and/or Attention Deficit (Hyperactivity) Disorder.

Centrally located in the Piedmont Triad region, The Piedmont School is 10 minutes from both Winston-Salem and Greensboro.

Testing

We administer *Woodcock Johnson III Tests of Achievement*, a standardized test which measures academic achievement. It is used to gather relevant, functional, developmental, and academic information about the student. The *WJ III Tests of Achievement* provide sound procedures for determining learning variances between abilities and achievement. Results of testing allow you to better:

- Determine learning variations
- Plan educational programs
- Plan individual programs
- Assess growth

Traditional Summer School

The Summer Program at The Piedmont School uses research-based methodology and focuses on language, reading, math and study skills.

The program will run July 5 through July 30.

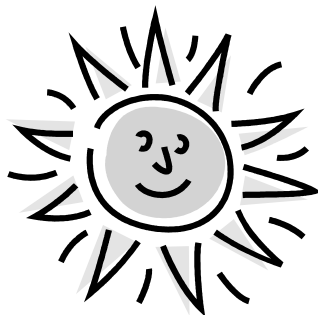
Rising first through fifth graders who need an intense small group learning environment will meet Monday through Friday from 8 to 11 a.m. Each day, students will have a 10-minute snack break.

All students receive free assessment testing prior to the start of their program.

Parents receive a written report and attend an individual parent conference at the conclusion of the program.

The maximum student to teacher ratio for these classes is 5 to 1. Students are placed in classes based on their grade level and their academic needs.

One-on-One Tutoring

Individualized tutoring in all academic areas is offered for first through twelfth grade students. Tutoring will be offered July 5 through July 30.

Student's specific academic needs are addressed in their tutoring plan. Parents receive a written progress report and attend a conference at the conclusion of their child's tutoring services.

Tutoring costs are \$50 per hour with a minimum of 8 hours. A 24-hour cancellation notice is required for all tutoring sessions.

Full refund will be given if requested session is not available

Students who withdraw for reasons beyond their control (e.g. serious illness) merit a prorated refund at the Director's discretion.

No refunds will be given for voluntary withdrawals or expulsions from summer school or tutoring.
